Note: Overnight travel may be required (potential for 2-4 nights monthly). Ability to work a flexible schedule, including some evenings and periodic Saturday mornings, is required.

Responsibilities include:

- Serve as faculty, through facilitation and delivery of longitudinal healthcare leadership courses & conferences, including project oversight and follow up, including travel to and from client sites *
- In collaboration with Hanley Center colleagues and clients, plan, design, and develop new programs and curriculum, including the use of online and blended learning modalities, to meet emerging health leadership needs *
- Design, revise, update curriculum, and participate in evaluation of curricula, along with other internal and external faculty, to ensure that course content continues to support overall learning objectives and organizational mission *
- Provide executive leadership coaching as requested for individual health and healthcare leaders
- Advise and support other faculty and facilitators as they work with their respective training sites

- Highly adaptable and flexible; punctual, meticulous, and reliable work habits
- Willingness to flex with the flow and needs of the organization

- Valid driver's license in good standing and reliable transportation for course and client off-site visits
